Reading

Our reading groups will be coming to a close this week. There may be some intermittent review of phonics concepts. However, we'll shift our focus to finishing final assessments and endof-year projects. We really want to have our reading skills cemented before summer break. Make sure you read consistently with your student over the summer so they don't lose progress over the break.

We have finished practicing each of our heart words for this year. We won't introduce any more, but we'll take some time here and there to practice any and all of those words. You can review them with your child at home. They are in his/her homework folder.

Your students have come a long way this year. Be sure to keep reading over the summer to maintain those skills. Lexia is available to use all summer!

Word Work/Phonics

We have finished our Phonics Units for this year. We will spend time reviewing concepts that we have covered. Then, we'll practice manipulating sounds in words. For example, we can change the first sound of "bat" to make the word "cat." Then, we can change the last sound to make the word "can."

<u>Writing</u>

We have covered all of our writing units this year with time to spare! We'll continue writing daily with plenty of reminders about basic conventions and revising. We want to be sure that our understanding of capitals, periods, spaces, etc., is very solid before the year is over.

Your students have been exploring lots of different ways to write this year. I would encourage you to keep practicing those over the summer. A simple writing idea for summer would be to keep a journal of fun activities and trips. Be sure that they practice basic conventions (ie: spaces, capitals, and punctuation).

<u>Math</u>

We'll be wrapping up our measurement unit this week. We need to be careful to line up our measuring tools with no gaps or overlapping so that we can get an accurate measurement.

Otherwise, we've covered a lot of different math skills this year. Some students would still benefit from some more practice with addition/subtraction story problems and math facts. Others still need help telling time (to the hour and half-hour) and working with fractions. Practice makes perfect!
