Our Field Trip to Tracy Aviary is THIS TUESDAY!! We can't wait! Remember that your child needs to match his/her lunch to what was marked on our forms. Reading

Our reading groups will be applying our phonics skill from last week (multisyllabic words) to reading a decodable text. If students have already mastered that skill, they may receive a leveled book to read.

During shared reading, we'll be talking and reading about holidays and how we celebrate them. While reading different texts, we'll discuss how good readers reread to make sure that they understand the story. We'll also use clues from the texts to identify the author's purpose. We want to understand why the author wrote the text (what lesson could we learn?).

Remember to review comprehension questions with your child after he/she reads. ("Start at the beginning and tell me what happened in that story." "What was the most important part? Why?" "What did that story remind you of?" etc.). You might even have your student write answers to these questions.

Word Work/Phonics

We have finished our Phonics Units for this year. We will spend time reviewing concepts that we have covered. Then, we'll practice manipulating sounds in words. For example, we can change the first sound of "bat" to make the word "cat." Then, we can change the last sound to make the word "can."

Writing

We have covered all of our writing units this year with time to spare! We'll continue writing daily with plenty of reminders about basic conventions and revising. We want to be sure that our understanding of capitals, periods, spaces, etc., is very solid before the year is over.

Otherwise, we will learn about adverbs that tell how. An adverb is a word that tells more about the action in a sentence. It can tell how an action happened. Many adverbs end in -ly. For example "The teacher spoke *softly*. She asked the children to *neatly* hang up their coats."

Math

We'll spend time exploring measurement this week. We will be comparing and ordering the length of various objects. We will even try to compare the lengths of two objects based on a third object. Then, we will measure various items using non-standard measurement (paper clips, cubes, popsicle sticks, etc.). That means that students can line measuring tools up straight with no gaps or overlapping. Students should be able to measure with any item/tool (crayons, cubes, paperclips, etc.).
