## Reading

Our reading groups will be applying our phonics skill from last week (long $u$, silent e) to reading a decodable text. If students have already mastered that skill, they may receive a leveled book to read.

During shared reading, we'll be talking and reading about different ways that people work with animals. While reading different texts, we'll discuss how good readers create pictures in their minds of what is happening when they read. This is called visualizing. We'll also use temporal words (first, next, then, last) to retell what happens in a nonfiction text.

Remember, we want children to try to solve words before we tell them what it is. If your child is struggling with a word, encourage them to "try that again" or ask if it "looks right," "sounds right," or "makes sense." These phrases encourage children to independently solve those problems with print. If they are still unsure, you can tell the word, but make sure that they try it first.

## Word Work/Phonics

We will be reviewing the long vowel silent-e syllable word pattern (ie: dude, late, kite, Pete, stove, etc.). Long vowel silent-e words have a single vowel, a single consonant, an $e$ at the end, and the vowel sound is long. Until recently, we've mainly focused on closed syllable words with short vowel sounds. It might be tricky to change our thinking from short vowels to long vowels.

## Writing

We will be doing some seasonal writing this week. Don't be surprised if you receive a little "love note" from your first grader.

Otherwise, we will learn about adverbs that tell when. Words such as first, then, next, soon, later, today, tomorrow, yesterday, early and always tell when an action takes place in a sentence. We want to include these in our writing as often as possible.

## Math

We'll be learning about data and surveys. We will be learning how to get and record data. There are many ways to represent data in a survey (tallies, pictures, writing names, etc.). We will also be learning how to understand/read recorded data. We want to be able to ask and answer questions about the data that we collect. If time allows, your student may have a chance to create and take his/her own surveys. It will be interesting to see how he/she decides to record the information on his/her own.

We'll continue to fit in our fact pages as time allows. This week, we are working on -8. In order to meet our goal of doing a complete page in 5 minutes, we are timing each row for a minute at a time. Usually, we can finish a row in a minute. I know that the more we do it the better we get. Watch for these papers to come home with your student. Feel free to correct any wrong answers or simply finish the problems if necessary.
